NOTES FROM THE BOARD

HOA Board Meeting- Redacted Minutes JULY 19, 2012

The meeting was called to order by Felicia Ayoub at 3:30 P.M.

The attendees were Felicia Ayoub, Walter Blanck, Barbara Caramore, Linda Nemeth and Jack Tyniec.

The Minutes of the meeting of June 19, 2012 were reviewed, Motion made by Linda and seconded by Walter to accept the Minutes; all in favor, Motion approved.

Financial Report

June income was \$49,649 and operating expenses were \$43,437 for a variance of \$6,212. Year to date income was \$280,620 and expenses were \$277,272 for a net income of \$3,348. We are still above budget on both income and expenses, but we still have expenses planned for adding salt water generators to the pool house. Health Dept. approval is still pending on these.

Bank balances (as of June 30) for the HOA are as follows:

July checks issued through July 24 totaled \$\$57,073.

Jack is still researching where to place the funds (\$50,000) to be withdrawn from the working capital account and invested in one or more insured CD's with a term not to exceed one year. This will be done to increase the return on our investments (currently 0.55% annually).

Ed Taylor has again spoken with Larry Gargano, negotiations continue regarding outstanding chimney problems.

We are still awaiting Department of Health approval as well as additional information regarding alternate methods of salinization /chlorination of the pool.

Asphalt work scheduled for June 2012 has been completed.

Decorative Gardens replaced one cherry tree off BPS which may need to be replaced again. Three trees have been removed from the area between (addresses) and replaced by one tree.

We are still waiting for a response from Court Order (Tennis Courts), they have been contacted again.

New Business

A motion was made by Linda, seconded by Walter, to hire Luis Calle Landscaping Co. to repair the wall in front of 44 GSD as well as to repair the cobblestone curbing between 104 and 106 GSD as well as in front of 116 GSD, for a total cost of \$600.00; all in favor, Motion approved.

Any resident having a concern about the existence of termites at their home must complete a maintenance form, leave in the appropriate place in the Clubhouse and PAM will investigate.

A report was filed by the Social Committee indicating that the July 4th party in the Clubhouse was a big success. The party was attended by sixty-four residents and the Social Committee made a profit of \$337.91, which includes a 50/50 profit of \$90.00.

Sometime between the evening of Tuesday, July 17, 2012 and the morning of Wednesday, July 18, 2012, the bulletin board outside the Clubhouse was vandalized. An unauthorized key was used to force open the lock on the left side of the bulletin board, (the section reserved for notices from the HOA BOD), and a copy of an article from the July 12, 2012 Riverhead News Review was posted. The door was then glued shut with paper napkins (from Starbucks) wedged between the door and the framework. In addition to needing to replace the locks on the bulletin board doors, the right side plexiglass must also be replaced inasmuch as it was cracked. The Riverhead Town Police were called on Wednesday afternoon and a report was taken in which they listed the incident as "criminal mischief". This is the third time community property has been violated. We may be forced to consider installing a video type security system which will cost the community an amount in excess of \$10,000.00 to help protect the property in Windcrest East.

The call box at the front gate has not been operating since July 16, 2012. Verizon was contacted and their line appears to be inoperative. A technician is scheduled to evaluate the system on Wednesday, July 25; meanwhile the guest gate will be left open.

The next meeting will be held on August 23rd.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:10 PM.

When using the tennis court, residents and their guests must wear sneakers with non-marking soles. Regular sneakers can be worn when using the shuffleboard court.


